Abstract - Australian South Sea Islanders represent a small community whose ancestors mainly came from Melanesian Islands to work as indentured labour in the sugar cane plantations of Queensland from the 1860's to the beginning of the 20th century. Many still live near the old sugar towns, but apart from an official recognition of their existence and distinctiveness by the Federal Government in 1994 and by the Queensland Government in 2000, South Sea Islanders' culture, economic and political roles are still underrepresented or even ignored in Australia. In the 1970's, writers belonging to that community, such as Faith Bandler, Mabel Edmund and Noel Fatnowna started to tell their own family history since the arrival of their first ancestors on the continent. These autobiographical accounts enabled them to reassert their identity as a culturally distinct group and to shed light on a part of Australia's forgotten past. Other written testimonies followed at the beginning of the 21st century but the lack of young South Sea Islander writers induced us to look at their other means of expression to promote their culture and complete the missing parts of their personal and collective history.

Abstract - The passage of Australia's Modern Slavery Act 2018 received bipartisan support and was heralded within both Houses of Parliament as a significant step towards addressing Australia's complicity in modern slavery. Political discourse surrounding the legislation, however, exhibits a profound and disconcerting dehistoricisation, emphasising particularities of global supply chains and contemporary transnational capitalism. Australia's own histories of slavery, slaverylike conditions and unfree labour are overwhelmingly absent from these narratives, which are framed instead by occasional references to the transatlantic slave trade. Attending particularly to histories of coerced Pacific labour within Australia, we analyse these absences as reflective of deeply rooted fissures of memory and power within Australia's national imaginaries, and of the exercise of colonial power both within the settler state and in its entanglements with the region. Through reference to two threads of Pacific labour history in Australia—the struggle for recognition of the 19th-century Pacific labour trade, and the labour patterns of 20th-century Papuan and New Guinean domestic workers—we argue for an alternate genealogy of modern slavery, one that re-centres attention to race and coloniality, and attends more fully to the presence of the past in the exploitations of the present.

Abstract - Pacific Islanders in Australia use the terms "Islander" and "Pacific Islander" in many ways and in different circumstances to define themselves and others. Through invoking discourses including these terms, Pacific Islanders both consciously draw on "panethnicity" and subconsciously strengthen and support their localized identities. In this way, Pacific Islanders blur the ethno-cultural and socio-political boundaries that traditionally separate groups with connections

across a diverse range of countries. Indeed, diasporic settings give rise to trans-nationalist sentiment and actions and serve to strengthen panethnic identity. Using insider and auto-anthropology and ethnographic research techniques, I draw on my experiences as an Australian of Pacific Islander descent and use examples drawn from my involvement in formalized community groups, cultural events, and social functions. In doing so, I argue that the expression of Islander and Pacific Islander identity is entwined with ideas about "race," place, stereotypes, and behaviour that highlight the dynamic ethnogenesis of this group.

Abstract - Most people both outside and inside Fiji are unfamiliar with the background of Fiji Melanesians. The reason for this has perhaps more to do with imperial expediency than accidental oversight. This article draws attention to the plight of this neglected and historically deprived ethnic minority group and examines events that led to its underprivileged status. It reports the well-intentioned but misguided past role of the Anglican Church in assisting the Melanesians. It also investigates recent attempts to improve their dire circumstances through the work of the self-organising Fiji Melanesian Community Development Association.
