



COVID-19 update

We continue to be in the 'Stand Up' phase of the [Queensland Health Pandemic Influenza Plan](#). This means that we are activating strategies to prepare for longer term management of our operations and service delivery. We are continuing to closely monitor the situation, with daily updates from the State Health Emergency Coordination Centre and the Queensland and Australian governments.

State Library continues to operate in line with the Australian and Queensland governments and advice provided by the Chief Medical Officer.

Introducing Agile Teams

From Monday 23 March, State Library will be introducing Agile Teams. Staff will be allocated by their People Leader to be in one of two groups within their teams – **Green** or **Blue**. Each group within teams will alternate weekly for working onsite and remotely (home or another location onsite or if you elect to work at Cannon Hill). Members of the **Blue** and **Green** teams should only communicate with one another virtually and not physically to mitigate the risk of a whole team being placed in self isolation.
