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Face mask restrictions continue

Today it was announced that the [current face mask restrictions in South East Queensland will be extended](#) to **6am on Friday 6 August**.

Please note that mask restrictions will also continue for anyone who has been in South East Queensland in the last 14 days.

Health advice

If you have any symptoms, [get tested](#) and isolate until you receive your results. Keep checking the list of [active contact tracing alerts](#) and follow Queensland Health advice if you were in any of the locations at the relevant times.

If you are going for a COVID-19 test, please email your People Leader and the [People and Culture mailbox](#) **immediately** and **do not come to the workplace while you are awaiting test results**. Then don't forget to notify your People Leader and People and Culture **as soon as you receive your result**.

Capacity limits

Capacity limits remain at one person per 2m² indoors, or 100% for events with ticketed allocated seating. Refer to our [capacities tables](#) for the limits.

Please also note the following:

- As State Library (South Bank) is classified as a 'restricted business', our lifts must comply with the current capacity limits (two people in the public lifts and four people in the internal dock lift).
- Capacity signage has been updated throughout the building, however we are moving away from signing each individual space and instead placing in areas that are at risk of overcrowding e.g. meeting rooms. However, if required, teams that are responsible for specific public areas can request a capacity sign from the [Facilities Operations team](#) to help manage visitor numbers in the space.

Staying safe

We each have a responsibility to read the [State Library COVID-19 Risk Assessment](#) to understand how we implement and comply with its measures. Adhering to the Risk Assessment is how we keep ourselves, our colleagues and our clients safe while working across our State Library premises. Please take the time to familiarise yourself with it.
