

- Empower Queenslanders to care for their collections at home or in their community organisations.









Light

Both sunlight and artificial light are harmful.
Light causes fading, embrittlement and discolouration.
Light damage is cumulative and irreversible.

Recommendations: Protect from direct light (both natural and artificial). Cover windows with thermally insulated curtains reliants

or binds. Use UV filters and non-UV emitting ght tub s. Use dimmers to lower light intensity ux).




