This guide is designed to help you discover items on **China (1931-1976)** that you can access on site, from your school or home.

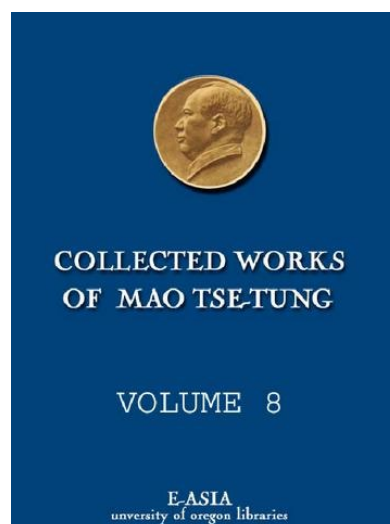
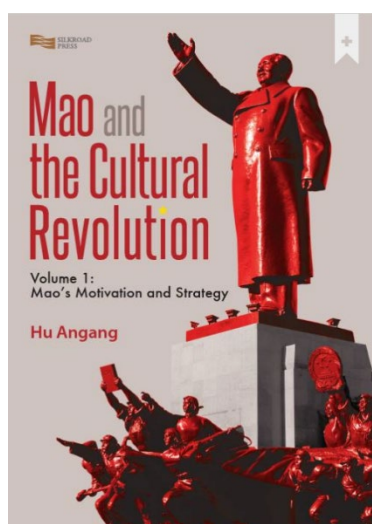
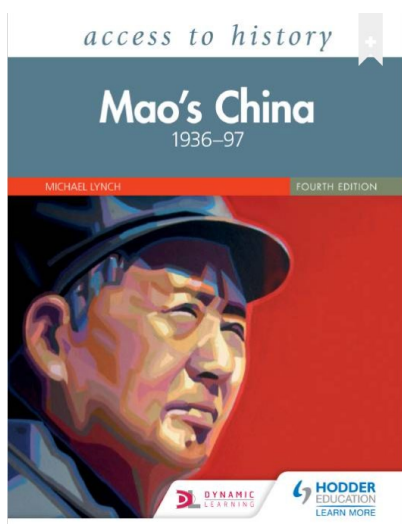


