This guide is designed to help you discover items on **Environmental movements since the 1960's** that you can access on site, from your school or home.

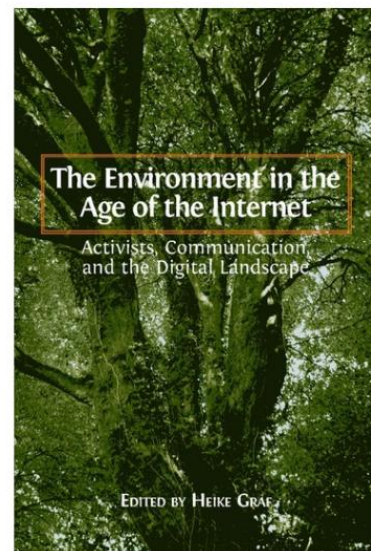
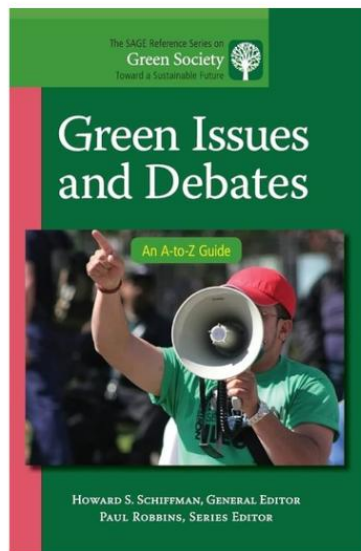
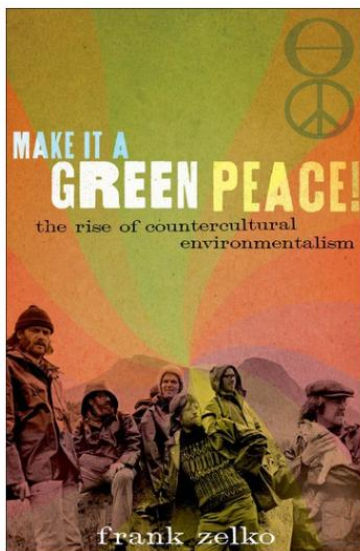
