## **AGCI : Australasian genealogical computer index**

Previously only available on microfiche, this is a surname index to 3.9 million mainly Australian and New Zealand records of the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries. The index draws on records from cemetery transcriptions, parish registers, newspapers, rate books, war memorials, and shipping records. However, indexes to the New South Wales Government Gazette 1832-1850 that were included in the microfiche edition are not on the CD. Entries provide surname, given name, place and date of event, type of record, name of the organization submitting the record and location within that organization.

## **AGCI Volume 2 : Australasian genealogical computer index volume 2: NSW government gazettes 1832-1863**

Volume 2 of AGCI contains an index to over 830,000 names mentioned in a variety of notices published in the New South Wales Government Gazette between 1832 and 1863. These notices include convicts, ship and military deserters, land transactions, unclaimed letters, government appointments and bankruptcies. The State Library of Queensland holds the New South Wales on microfilm and/or the original books.

The Australasian Medical Directory and Hand Book, contains a large amount of statistics and current medical information for all of the Australian states, New Zealand, and several of the Pacific islands including Fiji, Samoa and New Caledonia.

## ***Australasian Methodist ministerial general index***

Names of ministers in the Australasian Wesleyan Methodist Church from the beginning to appointments in 1896 are included together with an indication of the principal offices which each minister has held from the Conferences. It lists all the ministers for Australia and New Zealand with all of their appointments arranged alphabetically by each conference. The book also features the following: past presidents and secretaries, nationally and for each regional conference; more extensive biographical sketches, many with photos, of twenty deceased and distinguished ministers; In Memoriam - a list of ministers who have died since the first conference, giving name, birthplace, dates of birth, commencement of ministry and death. The whole text is searchable. Search for any word in the text - names, places and more.

This compendium set consisting of 7 individual Cyclopedias of different states (except two for Tasmania), comes on 11 CDs, and contains a total nearly 10,500 pages. They do vary a little between states, but primarily each contains information on services within the state, such as military, medical, banking, pastoral, government, educational, ecclesiastical, railways, post and telegraph, geographical, lands department and so much more. They also contain thousands of photographs (mostly of people), together with thousands of biographies.

It is a wonderful centennial biographical record of thousands of men of the time. This digital edition is unique and valuable in that it gathers all seven known variants of volume 2 into one complete fully searchable publication. All of volume 1 and much of volume 2 contain substantial biographies and full page illustrations of the person concerned. Most volume 2 volumes also include a significant selection of mini-biographies - enabling inclusion of many more than would have been possible in larger form. There are nearly 750 main biographies and over 3000 mini-biographies in the appendixes of some of the volume 2 series.

These three classifications enable the enquirer to see at a glance the Householders or Traders in any one Town; the Business and Address of any resident in the State; and the Firms engaged in any trade or profession.

## ***A bibliography of Australian family histories and genealogies***

This CD-ROM contains 11 359 family surname/book description entries and provides details of resources published in Australia relating to family histories and genealogies. The listings do not include manuscript or other archival material, or online-based resources. Each entry contains details of a published print or CD-ROM format family history that relates to the associated family name. These details include title, author/s, publisher, place and date of publication, number of pages, ISBN, types of content matter as applicable (such as portraits, family trees, etc). Also, each entry is tagged to indicate the State in which the first Australian-based generation described was originally established. The introductory pages provide detail as to how published works can be identified and located.

Listed alphabetically by surname, each of the children are indexed by their father's surname, where known, or otherwise by their mother's surname, then by their given names. Their year of birth, father's given names and aliases, together with their mother's given and maiden names and aliases, where known, are also shown. Date or year of birth or baptism and the place of the event is indicated where-ever possible. The State Library also holds this as a book.

## ***Colonial land and emigration commissioners' report 1850***

This CD-ROM is a digital reproduction of the original document. This is the official 10<sup>th</sup> general report of the Colonial Land and Emigration Commissioners. The first 58 pages provide insight into the state of various colonies in 1850. The remaining pages of the report have 56 appendixes which covering a wide range of interests. The report includes the following colonies: Australian colonies (New South Wales, Van Diemen's Land, Western Australia, South Australia), New Zealand, North American colonies (Canada, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Cape Breton, Prince Edward Island), Mauritius, West Indies, Cape of Good Hope, District of Natal, Ceylon, Labuan, the Falklands and Hong Kong. ## ***Emigrants from Hamburg to Australia 1850-1879***

This CD-ROM is a consolidation of the full 21 publications previously released, into one index and a set of linked PDF files. It covers all available departure lists for ships from Hamburg to Australia and New Zealand during the period of 1850-1879, and information such as name, former place of residence, age, occupation, ship, destination and departure years are recorded for more than 40,000 emigrants. The index allows direct searching, using QFHSDatasearch, on name, year and other details, with search results directly linked to the relevant PDF file of the original publications. Not only does it cover all the information from the original Hamburg listings, much of which is unavailable on corresponding arrival lists, but also includes, in the PDF files, information on the ship and reports extracted from contemporary newspapers.

## ***Employment & dispersal lists, assisted passengers arriving 1848-1854 : Arrivals at Moreton Bay, Port Phillip, Sydney & Twofold Bay***

These lists have been extracted from the NSW Governor's Despatches with the exception of the general and disposal list of the female immigrants on the \*Culloden which is from the NSW Colonial Secretary's In-Letters. Details include name, age and occupation, also births and deaths with dates for each and in most cases, the cause of deaths. The fields are: Surname, ForeName; Age; Occ[upation]; Ship; St[atus]; Dep[arture] Port; Arr[ival] Port; Ref[erence]; Remarks; NSW GD; Ship Report; Addl Docs [Additional Documents]. Fully searchable by most fields including Surname and ForeName, Ship, Arrival Port, Reference, Remarks and many others; or a combination of any of these; and also by Record Number OR Full Search which searches many fields in one search.
