## **AGCI : Australasian genealogical computer index**

Previously only available on microfiche, this is a surname index to 3.9 million mainly Australian and New Zealand records of the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries. The index draws on records from cemetery transcriptions, parish registers, newspapers, rate books, war memorials, and shipping records. However, indexes to the New South Wales Government Gazette 1832-1850 that were included in the microfiche edition are not

on the CD. Entries provide surname, given name, place and date of event, type of record, name of the organization submitting the record and location within that organization.

Names of ministers in the Australasian Wesleyan Methodist Church from the beginning to appointments in 1896 are included together with an indication of the principal offices which each minister has held from the Conferences. It lists all the ministers for Australia and New Zealand with all of their appointments arranged alphabetically by each conference. The book also features the following: past presidents and secretaries, nationally and for each regional conference; more extensive biographical sketches, many with photos, of twenty deceased and distinguished ministers; In Memoriam - a list of ministers who have died since the first conference, giving name, birthplace, dates of birth, commencement of ministry and death. ## ***Emigrants from Hamburg to Australia 1850-1879***

This CD-ROM is a consolidation of the full 21 publications previously released, into one index and a set of linked PDF files. It covers all available departure lists for ships from Hamburg to Australia and New Zealand during the period of 1850-1879, and information such as name, former place of residence, age, occupation, ship, destination and departure years are recorded for more than 40,000 emigrants. The index allows direct searching, using QFHSdatasearch, on name, year and other details, with search results directly linked to the relevant PDF file of the original publications. Not only does it cover all the information from the original Hamburg listings, much of which is unavailable on corresponding arrival lists, but also includes, in the PDF files, information on the ship and reports extracted from contemporary newspapers.

## ***Employment & dispersal lists, assisted passengers arriving 1848-1854 : Arrivals at Moreton Bay, Port Phillip, Sydney & Twofold Bay***

These lists have been extracted from the NSW Governor's Despatches with the exception of the general and disposal list of the female immigrants on the \*Culloden which is from the NSW Colonial Secretary's In-Letters. Details include name, age and occupation, also births and deaths with dates for each and in most cases, the cause of deaths. The fields are: Surname, ForeName; Age; Occ[upation]; Ship; St[atus]; Dep[arture] Port; Arr[ival] Port; Ref[erence]; Remarks; NSW GD; Ship Report; Addl Docs [Additional Documents]. Fully searchable by most fields including Surname and ForeName, Ship, Arrival Port, Reference, Remarks and many others; or a combination of any of these; and also by Record Number OR Full Search which searches many fields in one search.
