



Charles, Harry and Jim Londy had numerous business concerns throughout Queensland. Harry was in business in Ipswich for decades, as Charles was in Bundaberg





From 1910 Charles Cheros operated the Garden of Roses and Ellisos side by side in Edward Street Brisbane. The former had a long milk bar and marble soda fountain, where customers enjoyed iced coffee, kola soda and drinks with names like Floating Islands and Ladies' Favourites. By 1925 more than 70 Greek cafes traded in Brisbane
