### Rainbows and kookaburras: Neon exhibition lights up Queensland

Classic neon signs, including Stefan's iconic rainbow, will be on display at State Library of Queensland from 6 December just in time for summer.

*Neon* will illuminate the history of the noble gas turned marketing tool in Queensland from the 1940s to today, including the artisans who transformed glass bending into an art form.

The free exhibition will include original and restored neon works that tell an unexplored story of our state, from the winking Mr Fourex to legendary cafes and entertainment venues.

While these illuminated treasures were once a symbol of urban life and culture, many were destroyed when buildings were demolished or renovated.

Collectors began rescuing these signs to help preserve the history of the buildings and businesses they adorned.

Curator tours, hands-on workshops and film screenings will be held at State Library over summer to celebrate the glitz and glamour of this unique art form.

## **Exhibition highlights include:**

- Stefan's rainbow and Jo-Jo's cafe neon signs (including original sketches for the signs)
- The original Kookaburra Cafe neon signs
- A replica Mr Fourex sign, made from materials gathered from the old Regatta Hotel
- The Playroom sign (legendary Gold Coast venue)
- Rare footage and photographs of neon's history
- Original sketches and designs for some of Queensland's visual icons
