Census and muster records

What census records are available for Australia?

Prior to 2001 it was Australian federal government policy to destroy all census returns with names on them for privacy reasons. The census substitutes for Australia is electoral rolls. See Research guide – *Electoral rolls*.

Some 19th century census records have survived. These are valuable tools for locating ancestors in colonial Australia. Nick Vine Hall's book *Tracing Your Family History in Australia : A National Guide to Sources* 3rd ed. pp. 138-147 (FAMHIS 929.394 2002) contains detailed information about dates, coverage and location of early Australian census records.

New South Wales census and muster records

General musters

Held annually between 1795 and 1825, they Included all the inhabitants of the Colony. Other musters, taken more frequently and at different times, included musters of livestock, musters of convicts or musters taken specifically to include only males, females or children.

The first census of New South Wales

Held in November 1828, it is the only census to survive in full to the present day. Its aim was to record all the inhabitants of the colony at the time, and provides the individual's full name, age, place of residence, ship of arrival, occupation employer's name and place of residence.

State Library of Queensland holds the *1828 Census of NSW* in the family history reference area on level 3 (FAMHIS 929.3 1980) and on CD-ROM (QCFS 929.394 2001).

After the 1828 census, the **1841 census** is the most complete of the early census records for the colony. It is held on microfilm at MFL 929.3944 199- (AO/SR reels 2222, 2223, 2508, 2509). There is an *index* to this census at MFL 929.3944 199- (AO/SR reels 1350, 1351, 1352). The index is also online at https://mhnsw.au/indexes/census-and-musters/census-1841/.

Census and substitutes for Ireland

- The 1901 Irish census index for Fermanagh and Tyrone [microfiche] (MFCB 929.3415 1994)
- Griffiths valuation 1848-1864 [microfiche] (MFCB 929.3415 1978) and the *Tithe applotment books* c1823-38 [microfilm] (MFL 929.3 1990) are two valuable land records that substitute for destroyed censuses covering all Ireland. *Tithe Applotment Books* are also available onsite through ancestryLibrary edition.
- *Irish Flax Growers*, available onsite through ancestryLibrary edition, lists the 60,000 individuals growing flax for the Irish Linen Board in 1796.
